


The coronavirus outbreak began on November 17, 2019 in Wuhan, China. WHO officially declared it as a pandemic on March 19, 2020.

Officially the coronavirus arrived in Poland on March 4, 2020. On that day the Minister of Health announced the first confirmed case of SARS-CoV-2 infection.


In Slovenia COVID-19 was officially announced on March 4. as well, when the first infected human was found.



VIRUS FROM THE LAB




The COVID-19 outbreak is caused by an accidental release of the virus from the Wuhan Virus Research Institute laboratory



At the very beginning of the pandemic many people were afraid that shops will be closed so they bought products from shops leaving empty shelves.






Stop the madness!


The coronavirus vaccine would modify human DNA.




A lot of people believe that with vaccine we will receive a small microchip that will collect data about our location so it will be easier to control us.



Number of people who received at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine
